FOR TENANTS:

If you don't know where you will sleep tonight, please dial **2-1-1** for immediate assistance.

If you lost income due to the COVID-19 pandemic and need rental assistance, please visit <u>https://</u> <u>housing.bayareacs.org/</u>, call **510-899-9289** or email <u>Keepoaklandhoused@bayareacs.org</u>. The Keep Oakland Housed Program handles emergency rental assistance for the City of Oakland.

If you have received an eviction notice and are seeking legal representation, please contact the East Bay Community Law Center at **510-548-4040** and ask for housing intake.

The City of Oakland has a moratorium on most residential evictions during Oakland's COVID-19 State of Emergency. Exceptions are for Ellis Act or safety-related evictions. If you have questions about this moratorium or believe your landlord is violating its provisions, please contact the City of Oakland's Rent Adjustment Program by calling **510-238-3721** or sending an e-mail to <u>RAP@oaklandca.gov</u>.

Oakland's rent stabilization ordinance covers many older apartment buildings in Oakland and governs when and how your landlord can raise rent. The ordinance also requires the landlord to show "just cause" before evicting a tenant. FOR LANDLORDS:

If your duplex, triplex, or apartment building is covered by Oakland's rent stabilization ordinance (most pre-1983 buildings are), you must pay an annual registration fee in the Rent Adjustment Program. More details about your obligations and how to pay the annual registration fee can be found at <u>https://www.oaklandca.gov/resources/</u> tenant-property-owner-resources. The City of Oakland's Housing Department also holds free trainings to help landlords better understand their obligations – please email <u>RAP@oak-</u> <u>landca.gov</u> for more details on upcoming events.

If you have a soft-story apartment building (i.e. an unreinforced building with apartments located above a large garage or other empty space), you can learn more about Oakland's soft-story retrofit requirements here: <u>https://www.oaklandca.gov/</u> <u>topics/ssretrofit</u>. Oakland's Housing Department has a program (the Safer Housing for Oakland Program) that has in past provided grants to help property owners make these upgrades. Funding is currently not available, but you can email <u>ResidentialLending@oaklandca.gov</u> to be added to the waitlist for any future funding opportunities.

FOR HOMEOWNERS:

The City of Oakland Housing Department operates several grant and loan programs for owner-occupied home rehabilitation. These programs, which primarily serve low- and moderate-income homeowners, can help with weatherization, accessibility improvements, lead hazard abatement, and basic health and safety issues.
